Spelling (30 minutes)	<p>In today's session, you will be using Look, Cover, Write, Check to practise the words you have been learning.</p> <p>You can use the powerpoint as a guide or write on a piece of paper.</p> <p>This is also a time for you to practise your handwriting.</p>
