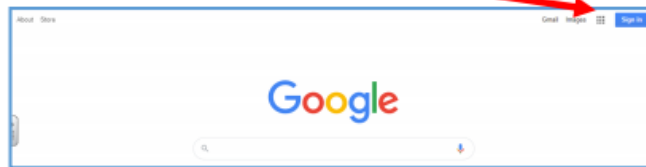

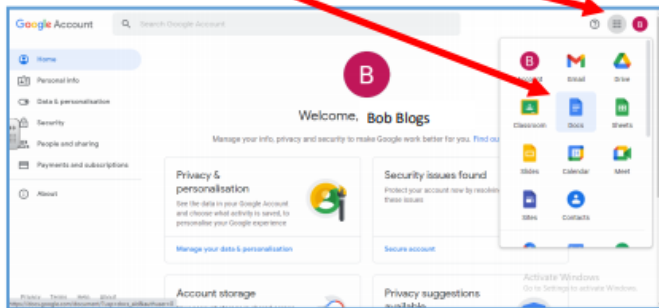
To get you started, open your web browser and go to www.google.com

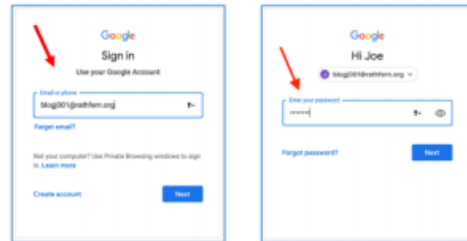
- 1) On your chosen internet browser, go to www.google.com
- 2) Click on the 'Sign in' tab to access your account.



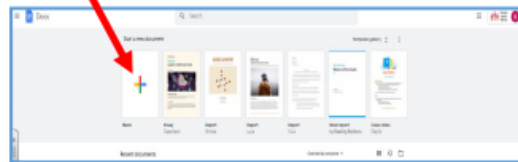
4. On the welcome page, you can manage account settings. Click on the keypad icon in the top right corner of the page. Then click on the Docs.



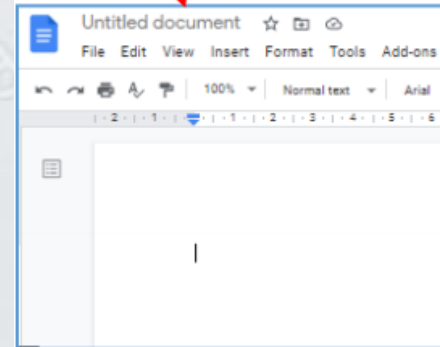
3. Enter your child's unique username and password.



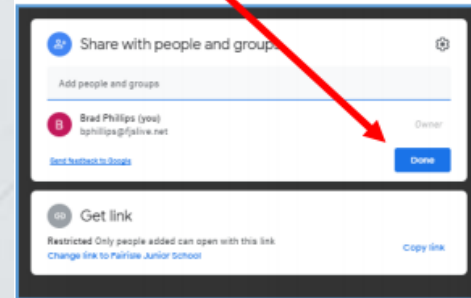
5. Once you have clicked on the docs icon, you can now create your own Doc.



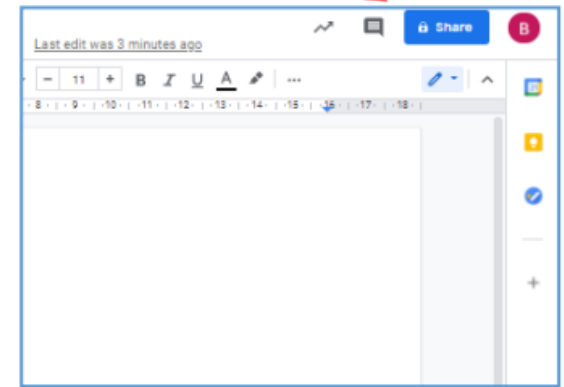
6. Untitled Document—Click on the grey lettering and then rename your Document.

Gruesome Gladiators

Being a gladiator in ancient Rome was serious business! Thousands of spectators would visit Amphitheatres to be entertained and watch gladiators fight. Although these skilled warriors were often classed as celebrities, many of the gladiators were slaves fighting for their freedom. A Lanista put potential gladiators through gruelling training regimes, until they became highly skilled and ready for combat – violent confrontations with other gladiators, wild animals and condemned criminals. Every gladiator had different strengths and areas of expertise in terms of fighting and weapons, which meant that the battles would be unpredictable and exciting to watch. It was possible for some of the best gladiators (those who survived) to make a lot of money and eventually retire as free men but they had to defeat many combatants over many years before this was even a possibility!
