Subordinate Clauses

When writing subordinating sentences, we must use subordinating conjunctions.

The <u>subordinate clause</u> provides additional information about the main idea.

Subject Verb

As the sun set, people put up their blackout blinds.

although so

as until

before when

since while

The <u>main clause</u> is the main idea of the sentence.

Fronted adverbials

Adverbials tell us when, where or how something is happening, which gives us more information in a sentence.

The adverbial moves to the front of the sentence to make it a FRONTED adverbial.


Earlier today, I discovered fronted adverbials.

Relative clauses use relative pronouns to give us more information in a sentence.

Parenthesis

Parenthesis is a word, phrase or clause inserted into a sentence to add extra information.

When the parenthesis is removed, the sentence still makes sense on its own.

I went to the cinema to meet James, my eldest brother.







Brackets and dashes can also be used to add parenthesis.

Why is this not a complete sentence?

As the men marched across the field.

It is not a complete sentence because...

There is no main clause. This is a subordinate clause that does not make sense on its own.

Therefore, it is an incomplete sentence.
