What is a noun?

A noun is a doing word (an action).

A noun is a describing word.

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Look at how the **verbs** and **nouns** change in these sentences.

I **cry** at sad films.
Mum **cries** at sad films.

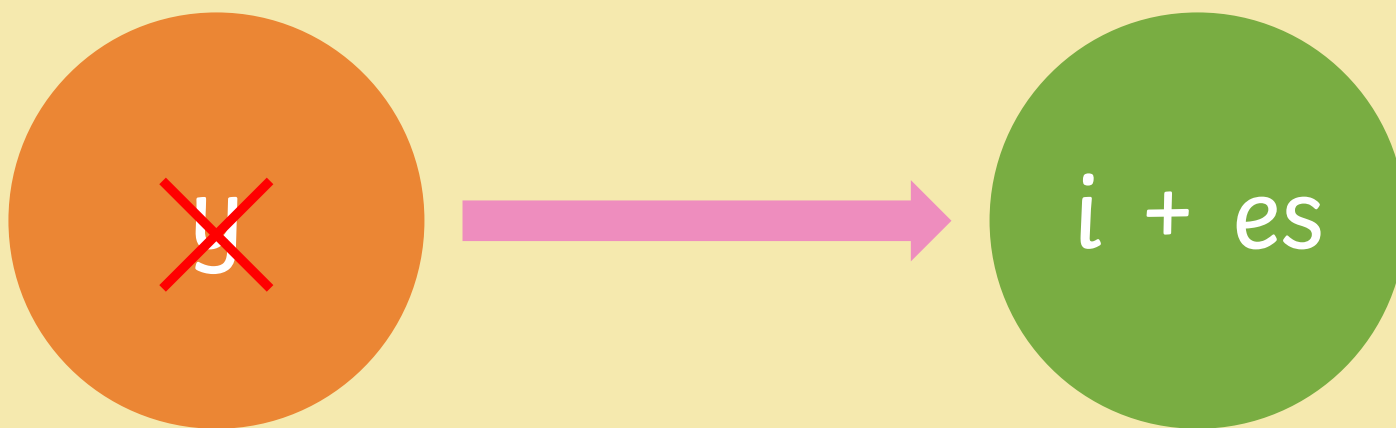
I **try** to learn my spellings.
Lucy **tries** to learn her spellings.

What a sweet **baby**!
What a lot of sweet **babies**!*

We are waiting for one more **reply** to the party.
We are waiting for two more **replies** to the party.*

* a noun
ending in y
is changed
to 'ies' for
plurals
(more than
1)

The **y** is changed to **i** before **-es** is added.
