<u>Captain Sir Tom Moore – Early Life & Family</u>

Captain Sir Tom Moore was born in Keighley, West Riding of Yorkshire, on the 30th April 1920 and grew up in the town. His parents were Isabella and Wilfred Moore. His father was from a family of builders, and his mother was a head teacher. Moore was educated at Keighley Grammar School and started an apprenticeship in civil engineering.

In his youth, Tom's hobbies included motorcycle racing and he won several competitions. Captain Sir Tom Moore married Pamela in January 1968 and they had two daughters, Lucy and Hannah. When Moore was working at Cawood March Concrete, the family lived in Welney in Norfolk. The couple retired to the Costa del Sol in Spain, but returned when Pamela became unwell. She spent her last years in a nursing home, where Moore would visit her every day. She died in 2006. In 2008, Moore moved in with his daughter Hannah, her husband, and his two grandchildren, in Marston Moretaine, Bedfordshire, where he lived until his death. He also had two other grandchildren.


