
L.O. I am learning to divide with remainders.

23 ÷ 4 =	24 ÷ 4 =


What is the largest remainder you can have when you divide by 3?

 $22 \div 4 = 5 \text{ r } 2$
 $23 \div 4 = 5 \text{ r } 3$
 $24 \div 4 = 6$

What is the largest remainder you can have when you divide by 3?2.......

What is the largest reminder you can have when you divide by 4?3........

What is the largest reminder you can have when you divide by 5?4......

What pattern do you notice?

The largest possible remainder is always 1 less than the original number.
