Times Tables (15 mins)	You will be tested on your division facts . You have a choice of challenges to choose from, but remember that it's good to practice the times tables that you're less confident with. You have a choice of which division test you do: Very Mild which is dividing by 2; Mild which is a mix of <i>2, 5 & 10 division facts</i> ; Hot which is a mix of <i>3, 4 & 8</i> division facts and a final Very Hot challenge of all <i>division facts in the 12 times tables</i> .
Reading (45 mins)	<u>L.O. I am learning to answer language questions.</u> Today you will be continuing your learning about an author's choice of language and how that impacts the reader's opinion of Mary Anning.
