Maths 1 hours	<u>L.O. I am learning to multiply 3 digits by 1 digit.</u> Today you will be using your knowledge of multiplication and formal methods to multiply 3 digits by 1 digit. If you have made any errors, can you see where you have made a mistake and correct them? <i>Challenge: Complete the Maths challenges for today's learning</i>
English 1 hour	<u>L.O. I am learning to gather information and evidence for a newspaper report.</u> In today's lesson, you will be learning how journalists gather information from witness statements photographic evidence. Watch the video lesson and complete the activities as you go.
History 1 hour	<u>L.O. I am learning to identify primary and secondary sources through enquiry.</u> In today's lesson you will learn more about the Egyptians by exploring a range of sources. You will make predictions about what you think each source is, why it was used and who it was used by. There is an answer sheet that explains all of the sources so that you can see how close you were to the truth! Complete the exit pass at the end of the lesson.
Reading 40 minutes	<u>L.O. I am learning to demonstrate my understanding of a text.</u> Now that you are more familiar with chapter 2, you will be using what you know to answer questions.
