<p>English 1hr</p>	<p><b><u>L.O. I am learning to identify the main characters and the setting in a narrative.</u></b> In today's lesson you will be learning about the opening scene of a movie version of Roald Dahl's <i>BFG</i>. When you verbally answer the questions from the teacher, try to respond in full sentences; even though we cannot hear you it will help to develop your vocabulary. <p>Science 1hr</p>	<p><b><u>L.O. I am learning what fossils are and how they are made.</u></b> A fossil is the preserved remains or impressions of a living thing from prehistoric times. These can include bones, footprints, shells, objects preserved in amber &amp; petrified wood. The process takes millions of years and needs particular conditions for a fossil to be formed.
