Some of the most impressive cave paintings have only been found in the last 100 years. There could be more out there we don't know about!


## **Cave Paintings**






#### Lascaux Cave

This cave is located in north-western Bulgaria. Bones from different prehistoric species of bears and hyenas have been discovered in the Magura Cave. Some of the paintings decorating the walls date back to the Neolithic period.



#### **Chauvet** Cave

Located in Southern France. In addition to the paintings and other human evidence, the three speleologists who first explored it also discovered fossilised remains, prints, and markings from a variety of animals, some of which are now extinct. Speleology = the scientific study of caves


Have a think about what most of the cave paintings are showing.

Have a look at these different symbols of animals and try to use them in your cave art sketch.


