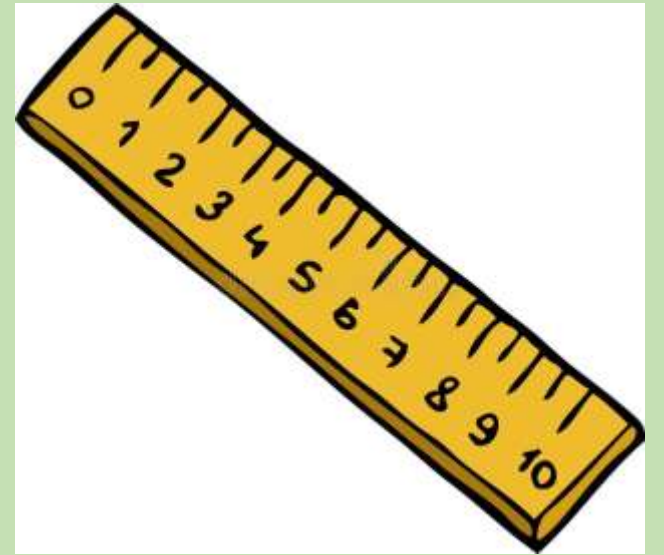


Journalistic Writing

What is journalistic writing?

- Text written by a journalist.
- Journalists collect, write, present, edit or comment on news and current affairs.
- News is a recount of current, significant events.
- Written news reports are found in newspapers or online.

Carter discovers missing Egyptian tomb

Late yesterday evening, Howard Carter (a British archaeologist) discovered a previously unopened tomb of the Pharaoh Tutankhamen in the Valley of Kings after 30 years of searching.

- **Summaries key information (who, what, where, when)**
- **Provides reader with an overview of the event**

What is the purpose of the chronological recount paragraph?

- Provides detailed information about the event.
- Recounts events in chronological (time) order
- Helps the reader understand exactly what happened

3.	The first room was filled with rubble and broken jars and pots.
4.	Witnesses claim that Howard carter found a second sealed doorway inside the first chamber
5.	Howard Carter made a small hole in the doorway and claimed he saw 'Wonderful things... Wonderful things'.
6.	The Egyptian Officials saw life-size figures, golden beds, alabaster cups, chariots and a richly decorated throne.
