French 20 minutes	<p><u>LO: I am learning to spell the names of family members in French</u></p> <p>In today's lesson, we will be recapping our learning of family names and then learning how to spell names using the French alphabet. Reading 40 minutes	<p><u>L.O. I am learning to develop my fluency when reading out loud.</u></p> <p>As you continue to read our text for this half term, you will be using strategies that you are familiar with now to develop your fluency as you read. You will then perform an extract to someone at home.</p>

I am learning to write the quotes paragraph of a newspaper report.</u></p> <p>Today, we will be writing the quotes paragraph of the newspaper report, we will discuss the key features of this paragraph and look at an example of a quotes paragraph. Please work your way through the slides and complete the task at the end of the lesson.</p>
Science 1 hour	<p><u>LO: I am learning what the melting and boiling point are for each state of matter.</u></p> <p>In today's lesson, you will be learning about the different boiling and melting points of solids, liquids and gases. Please start by having a go at the quiz. How many can you get correct? Make sure you join in as much as you can, pausing the video and completing the activities as they come up.
