




Cave paintings

Let's have a look at some cave paintings and remind ourselves of the colours that were used!








REDS

By adding black to our starting colour, we create a new **SHADE**.



Plan your cave painting in your sketch book!

Remember:

Outline of animal

Not too much detail or facial features

Use a printed outline if you need some inspiration for your artwork



1. Rip along the edges of your piece of paper.
2. Draw the outline of your animal using a pencil.
3. Paint your animal using cave painting colours, mix the right tones and shades!

After it has dried, screw up the piece of paper to make it look like it was painted on a rock!
