

## 6MA Monday

English (1 hour)	In today's lesson, you will look at some examples of narrative openings in order to gather ideas for your own writing. You will look at the openings to some famous novels and begin to analyse why they are effective. Then, you will have a go at writing your own engaging opening. Keep this safe, as you will be able use this as a starting point for your narrative writing later in the week.
Maths (1 hour)	<p>In today's lesson, you will be revising measurement. You will recap converting between metric units of measure for mass and have a go at solving worded problems. Spelling (1 hour)	<p>In this lesson, you will be tested on some of the curriculum words. You will need a pen, colouring pencils and some paper. Open the link from 7.14, watch the video and take the test. Take some time to practise these spellings using a selection of spelling strategies that you know e.g. pyramid words, red vowels, drawing around the word, speed-writing, crazy font, look-say-cover-write-check etc. As well as using a variety of spelling strategies, write a sentence for each spelling. e.g. desperate – I was so desperate to open my Easter egg! If you are unsure what the word means, use a dictionary or look online for the meaning of the word and examples of sentences, if needed. Once you have been tested, check your words and mark them.
