A Message from our Vice Chair of Governors

I have been a Governor of Fairisle Junior School for nearly 20 years and over that time I have seen many changes to our amazing school. Earlier this year, our children and staff experienced the 'trauma' of an Ofsted inspection and I am sure you will have been very pleased to learn that we have been graded 'Good' once again. This grading, in my view, does not adequately define our incredible school or the dedicated work of its staff and its amazing pupils. It has been my great privilege, as a Governor, to see the school grow and develop to an outstanding school in every way. As a measure of our success we have now over 400 pupils, the largest number in the school's history and as 40% of our pupils are out of their normal school catchment area, it suggests that parents and children regard Fairisle as the school of choice rather than attend a closer and more convenient alternative.



As Governor I have a special responsibility to monitor the provision of English, including the teaching of Phonics for those pupils who require additional support with reading and writing. I also monitor Attendance, which you may be aware the school is working particularly hard in order to return to our pre-Covid level. Please can I ask for your special cooperation to ensure your child attends school regularly and on time. Please share any difficulties you may be experiencing with the school. They are always ready and willing to assist.

Additionally, I have a particular focus on Inclusion, to ensure that those pupils with Special Educational Needs receive the appropriate support and that their education is not disadvantaged in any way. As parents your support and engagement with Fairisle is crucial to your child's education and our future success and we as Governors are always happy to meet with you to discuss any of your suggestions and concerns over your child's education and wellbeing.

Attendance — Autumn Term 2023

Everyone knows that attendance at school has taken a prominent place nationally and I am very pleased to be able to let you know that it continues to improve here at FJS. Last year during the autumn term attendance was 92.15%. This year for the same period attendance is now 94.21%.

Very well done to everyone in 6CT (97.72%), 4HH (96.57%) and 3EC (96.75%), whose attendance has been better this term than our pre pandemic school target of 96.5%.

Congratulations to the **109 children** who have attended school **on time everyday** this term. This is a really great achievement. I have challenged the children to increase this for next term. Let's go for it!

During the first week back after the Christmas holiday, we will be sending every parent a new report showing their children's attendance for the autumn term. We will then repeat this after the Easter holiday and in everyone's annual report, which will go home at the end of June.
