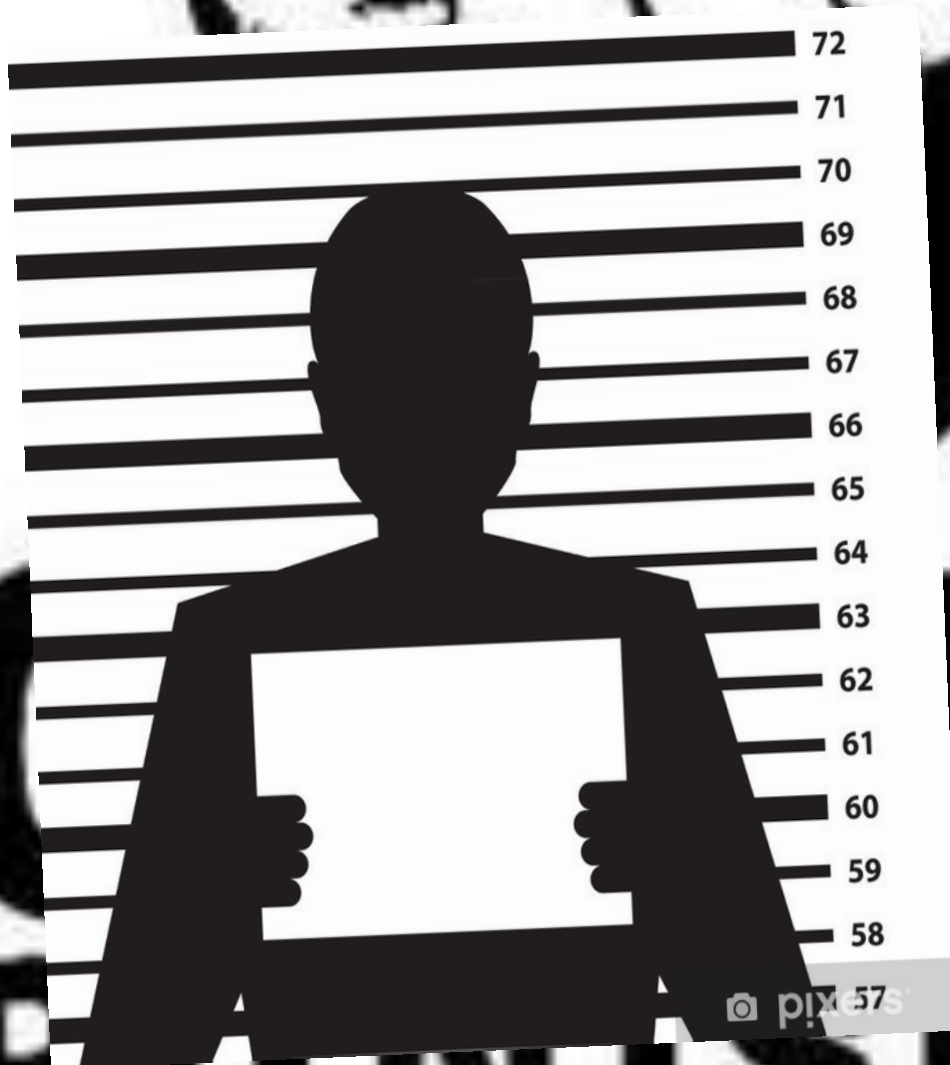
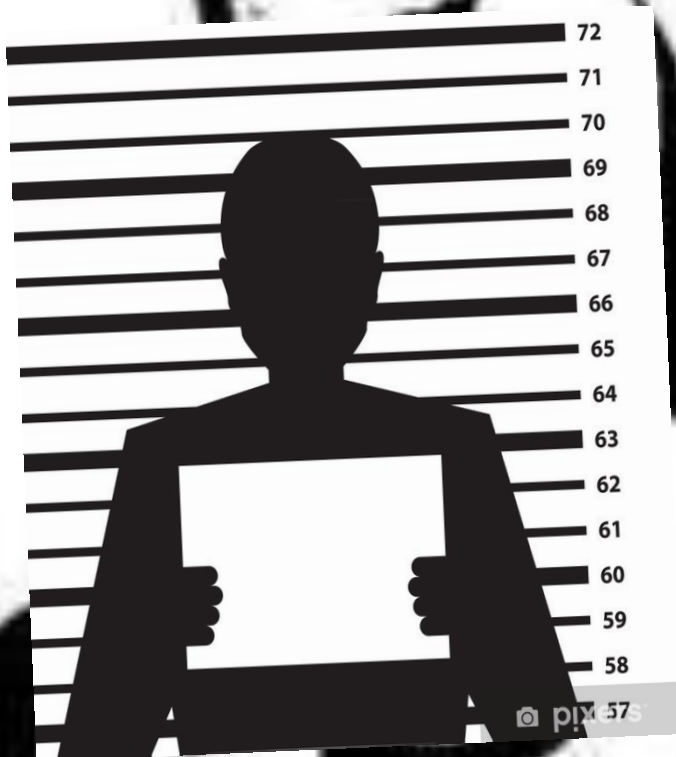

What is meant by 'Historical Enquiry'?

Historical inquiry is the process of “doing history”. It is a process that begins with the asking of historical questions. This is followed by finding and analysing primary and secondary historical sources (where you find the information). As historians, you then need to think about how reliable the sources are..

L.O. I can pose questions about the past and enquire.

Any enquiry needs to begin with asking questions. The best place to start is to find information about who, when and where questions.

'Who is the criminal?'

'When did the criminal commit the crime?'

'Where was the crime committed?'



When did they die?

When was our character alive?

Where did they live?

Who did our character commit a crime against?
