

Remote Learning Timetable

Please see below your lessons for today. Below is a suggested order, however, it is up to you which order you do your lessons. Although, there will be times where we will be meeting online, using Zoom. It is important that you check your emails for any zoom links. Friday 22nd January 2021	
Maths (1 hour)	<p><u>L.O. I am learning to divide by 3.</u></p> <p>Again we are going to need to put our times tables knowledge to use. You are going to be answering word problems, showing that you are able to <u>divide by 3</u>. Open the PowerPoint for Maths and follow the slides. You will also have a video to watch and follow, to help you with your learning. Again pick tasks which are best suited to you. If you are finding something too easy or too challenging, change the sheet that you are working on. Remember you do not have to do all of the maths sheets – pick one task and one challenge.</p>
English (1 hour)	<p><u>L.O. I am learning to write a poem.</u></p> <p>In English, you are now going to use everything that you have learnt this week to help you write your own poem. We are going to follow the same structure of the first stanza in the 'The Sea' by James Reeves. However, if you wish to create your own structure, that is fine too. We just ask that you describe the storm in Mousehole Cat and you have a go at using personification. We hope to see some of these amazing poems. You can email us a picture of it written on paper or typed up; or you can perform your poem and send a video.</p>
Spelling (30 minutes)	<p><u>L.O. To investigate more suffixes: Past and present tense</u></p> <p>Applying the -ing suffix to create present tense verbs.</p> <p>https://classroom.thenational.academy/lessons/to-investigate-more-suffixes-past-and-present-tense-cn30t</p>
French (20 minutes)	<p><u>L.O. I am learning about singular and plural in French animals.</u></p> <p>We are continuing to practice the names of animals in French. Today we are going to be looking at how the spelling and your pronunciation may change if there is one animal or more than one.</p>

Science (1 hour)	<p><u>L.O. I am learning to understand different reflective surfaces.</u></p> <p>Today you will look at reflective surfaces and carrying out an investigation around your home. You will need a torch or ask your grown up if you can borrow the torch on their mobile phone. Follow the PowerPoint and it will explain everything to you.</p>
