French 20 minutes	Today, you are going to be continuing learning your Positions in French. Maths 1 hour	Today, you are going to be revising your learning on counting in tenths. If you have made any errors, can you see where you went wrong and correct your work? Challenge: Try any of the maths challenges set for today if you have completed your work and want to challenge yourself.
Reading 40 minutes	Today there is no PowerPoint. You will be using your learning from our prior lessons to predict what you think might happen in Chapter 7. Remember this is a 'guess', using clues from the text to support your ideas. Use evidence from the text to support your predictions. Your teacher would like to read you predications from today's lesson.
English 1 hour	Today you will continue to draft your non-chronological reports. Follow the PowerPoint to complete your remaining main paragraphs. There are resources in today's folder to support you if you are finding writing difficult. Remember, it is OK to magpie ideas! Challenge: Read your work to someone at home to make sure it makes sense then underline the different sentences you have included in different colours.
History 1 hour	In History today, you will be building upon your knowledge of the legacies that the Romans left behind in Britain. You should take notes as you learn as you might want to include some of this information in your non-chronological reports.
