<u>Captain Sir Tom Moore – Career</u>

As an adult, Tom Moore enlisted in the 8th Battalion, Duke of Wellington's Regiment at the beginning of the Second World War and was stationed in Cornwall. He was selected for officer training in 1940, and attended Officer Cadet Training before becoming a second lieutenant on the 28th June 1941. During his time in the army, Moore served in India and Burma and by October 1944 he had been promoted to the rank of captain. On his return to Britain, he served as an instructor in armoured warfare in Bovington, Dorest. During his time in the army, Captain Tom was awarded three medals, which he has worn whilst completing his fundraising laps. After the war, he worked at a concrete production company (Cawood Concrete Products), where he was later appointed manager. He was dedicated to his work and eventually worked his way up to managing director of the company. Captain Tom Moore later renamed the company March Concrete Products Ltd, which continued to trade until 1992.




