
Dictionary Neighbours

We have been learning about the life of Captain Sir Tom Moore. This week you are going to write a story about him. Today you will plan your narrative.








- We can think about the purpose of our writing
 (Why we are writing it)
- 2. We can think about who our audience will be (who will read it)
- 3. We are clear about WHO we are writing as (as yourself or someone else)
- 4. We can make sure that we are using the correct features of the writing style
- 6. It gives us somewhere to get our ideas out of our heads so that we don't forget them!

You are going to use an S plan for your narrative. Here is an example.

The middle is where something happens in the story.

You should think about the different sections to your story: opening, middle, ending.

Think about how time will move on in your story. Try not to tell a story of a long period of time. This is harder to do.



Your opening should describe the setting for your story. Use expanded noun phrases to create a picture in your reader's mind.

Here are some ideas to help you.

Opening:

- Set during the war when Captain Sir Tom served in the British Army. The setting is in a trench.
- Set during his time as the manager of the concrete company.
- Set at his daughter's home, where he lived during the pandemic. The setting is mainly in the garden.

Middle:

- Captain Sir Tom injures himself.
- He makes a friend (at school, in the army, at the concrete factory).
- He decides to do something to help the NHS.

Ending:

- His friend helps him

 (when he is injured, in
 the concrete factory, to
 fundraise).
- He enjoys spending time with his new friend.
- His fundraising is reported on the news and thousands of people donate.
