

## Can you crack the codes sent on D-Day?


Below are real messages that were intercepted from the Germans on D-Day. Use the key to crack the codes. What do you think each message could mean?








Challenge? Write your own secret messages using a key you have created. Then give them to someone else to decode.


## ANSWERS: Can you crack the codes sent on D-Day?



What does it mean? This was important information as the British learnt that the Germans were getting their troops ready.
