

A sentence is a group of words that are put together to mean something. A sentence is the basic unit of language which expresses a complete thought.

A complete sentence has at least a subject and a main werb to state (declare) a complete thought.



You use sentences ALL THE TIME!! BUT...

In a piece of writing, how can we recognise where the end of a sentence is?



So what is the biggest problem when we are writing rather than reading?

What strategies can we use to help us write sentences that are correct?



When we write sentences, we should:

- Plan out your complete ideas, your sentences, in your head before you write them. DON'T JUST WRITE!
- Think about where you would breathe
- Consider whether you are changing topic or idea



How can we check that we have put full stops in the correct places?
