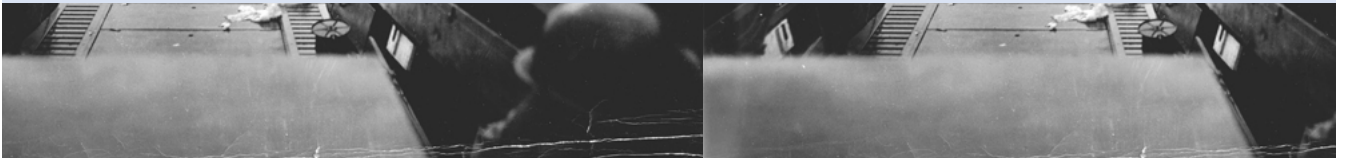

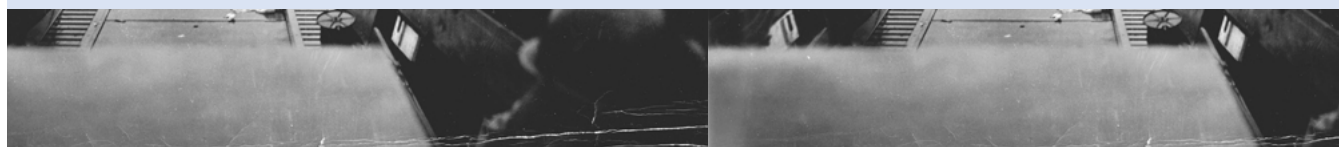

Recap...

Golden Rules of Dialogue

1. All dialogue must be contained in speech marks.
We call these inverted commas.
2. Before the end of the inverted commas, you must add punctuation (, ! ? .)
3. When a new person is speaking you must start a new line.
4. Include who said what and how they said it.



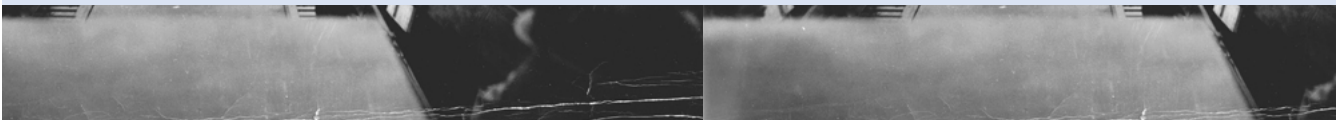


Recap...

In a story, dialogue should do one, if not all, of the following:

1. Reveal characters' relationships to one another.
2. Move the story forward.
3. Increase the tension.

Don't put it in unless it is doing one of these things!

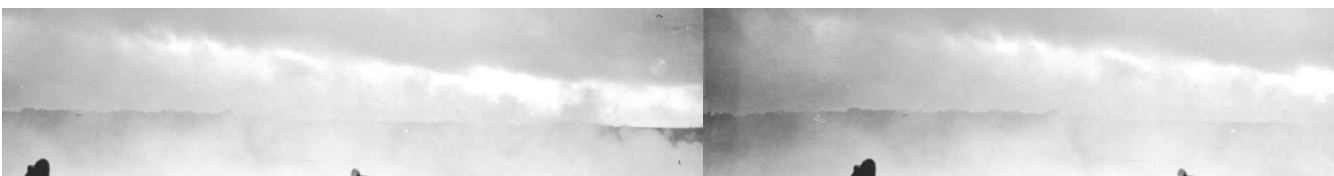
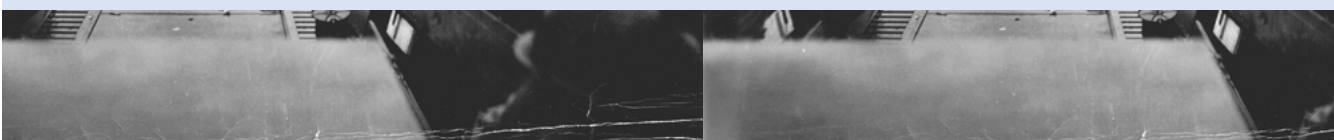

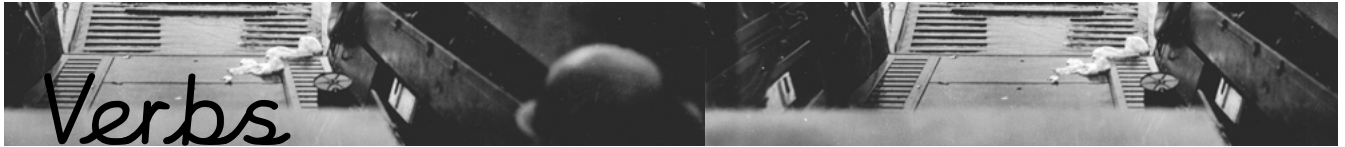


Task
