


## 'ff' and 'ss'


The /f/ and /s/ sounds at the end of short words are **usually** spelt with the digraph 'ff' or 'ss' if they come after a e i o u (a vowel).














## 'ff' and 'ss'

Can you write a 'ff' on your table?




Can you write either an 'ss' or an 'ff' on a partner's back?

## Be Careful!

Some words don't follow the usual rule.

In these words, the /f/ or /s/ sound come after a single vowel but they are spelt with a single letter.
