2. Look on page 128, what does the author want to tell you by using the simile 'like a cheerful, older brother?'
3. Look on page 132, the author says Frederick 'took a packet of cigarettes from his jacket that was hanging on the tailgate and stood, sullenly smoking.' What can you infer from this?
4. Find a quote about Frederick from the text. Write down the quote in your book. Underneath use PEE to explain what you can infer from this quote.
