

No-one really knows how or why Stonehenge was built but there are lots of theories. A **theory is an idea**. Some theories are better than others because they use **evidence** to support their idea.

We are going to play Call my bluff.

There are **3 possible theories** that you can either disagree with or agree with, but you will need to <u>explain why you think this</u>.



### Theory 1

Some people believe that a race of giants who were almost totally wiped out by Noah's flood, used their greater height and strength to help build Stonehenge.



Noah's flood is a biblical story where Noah built an ark to save the animals.

#### Theory 2

Some people believe that hundreds of men managed to place the stones onto large logs and roll them hundreds of km over land.



#### Theory 3

Some people believe that the last ice age meant melting glacier (massive blocks of ice) pushed the Stones closer and then they used rafts to carry the stones downstream.


