400 and Counting!

Earlier this week, we had major cause to celebrate as, for the very first time in our school's history, we have 400 children in our 14 classes here at Fairisle Junior.

To give you some context around this magic number and what it means to us, when I joined Fairisle Junior in July 2007, we had 267 children in 10 classes in our school (54 in Year 3, 67 in Year 4, 86 in Year 5 and 60 in Year 6). Now we have 88 children in Year 3, 120 in Year 4, 86 in Year 5 and 105 in Year 6.
